Welcome to the 2023 DC State Fair!

Thank you for your interest in our contests to showcase the agricultural, culinary, and artistic talents of the DC community. In this guide you will find the general rules that apply to all contests, and the specific rules for each individual contest.

Please read each contest's rules carefully to understand when and where to submit your entry for judging. Most contests will be judged prior to the day of the fair. Contest winners will be announced at the fair, on September 10, 2023 at Franklin Park. An exact time will be shared closer to the date, when the agenda for the day is published. Contest winners will also be posted on the DC State Fair website.

General Rules

- 1. Participation in most contests is open to all residents of the District of Columbia as well as Montgomery County, Arlington County, Prince George's County, and Alexandria. Where there are exceptions, they are specified in the individual contest's rules.
- 2. All contests are open to all ages, except any deemed exclusive for youth or those that are age restricted (e.g., beer, cider). Individuals under the age of 18 seeking to enter contests require approval from their parent/guardian.
- 3. To maintain fairness, no one deemed as a professional in a contest field may submit an entry. For example, a professional baker may not enter the bread contest.
- 4. Entries must be original and created by the individual submitting the entry, though they can be based on published recipes. No copyrighted materials or images, including copyrighted characters (e.g., comic and/or television characters), photographs, and magazine or newspaper illustrations may be included in contest submissions.
- 5. All food/drink contests require a list of ingredients submitted with the entry on judging day.
- 6. Only individuals may enter contests, though affiliations can be specified. For example, Denise Smith submitting a tomato grown by 5th graders at the Mundo Verde Bilingual Public Charter School garden.
- 7. All entries must be accompanied with a removable label that includes the name of the individual submitting them, the contest they are being submitted for, and the name of the entry.
- 8. Entries must be submitted by the deadline described in the individual contest rules.
- 9. The DC State Fair reserves the right to close registration before the stated deadline for any contest that receives more than 30 entries. The DC State Fair reserves the right to cancel any contest that does not receive at least two entries on judging day.
- 10. No profanity or sexually explicit content may be submitted for any of the contests. The DC State Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry deemed inappropriate or ineligible. Contest entries may be disqualified for failure to comply with regulations of the DC State Fair or the District of Columbia, or for any reason deemed appropriate by the DC State Fair President or Contests Committee Chair (or their designees).
- 11. DC State Fair officials are not responsible for lost items, so consider bringing entries in disposable (preferably recyclable or compostable) containers. Any non-disposable containers will be available for claiming at the fair, then donated or disposed of at the close of the event if not claimed.
- 12. Upon submission, culinary contest entries become the property of the DC State Fair. Agricultural and artistic contest entries can be returned to contest participants after judging, upon request.
- 13. Contest participants grant the DC State Fair the right to utilize the submitted materials in future fair promotions or activities.
- 14. Members of the DC State Fair Board of Directors may not participate in any judged contests.
- 15. Sponsors of a contest, or employees of an organization sponsoring a contest, may not submit entries for the contest they or their organization is sponsoring.
- 16. Individuals submitting contest entries cannot judge the contest(s) in which they enter but may judge other contests.

- 17. Contest winners must be present on the day of the fair to collect their ribbons or make special arrangements with one of the members of the DC State Fair Board of Directors to collect their ribbons after the fair.
- 18. All decisions are final. There will be no appeals.

Agricultural Contests Rules

Compost

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Compost

RULES

- 1. All entries must be submitted in a reusable, easy-to-open container containing at least two cups of compost.
- 2. Individuals may not submit more than one entry.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Consistency (40%)
 - a. Compost is dark in color and original materials can no longer be distinguished. If there are larger clumps present, they easily break apart when squeezed.
- 2. Smell (30%)
 - a. Compost smells earthy, not sour or mildewy.
- 3. Moisture Level (30%)
 - a. Compost is moist, not dry or soggy.

- 1. Register for the compost contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- Bring your entry, accompanied with a removable label that includes your name, the contest
 category, and the name of the entry, to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St
 NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer
 to the date.

Egg (Chicken)

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

• Best Egg (Chicken)

RULES

- 1. Each egg entered must be from a backyard pet chicken or a school garden chicken.
- 2. Each egg must be properly cleaned, dried, and placed in an egg carton before being received for judging.
- 3. Any entry that is visibly dirty or has an odor will be disqualified.
- 4. Individuals may submit up to two entries.

JUDGING CRITERIA

1. Weight (25%)

- a. Egg weighs at least 1.92 ounces and no more than 2.33 ounces.
- 2. Uniformity of Color (25%)
 - a. Egg is consistent in color.
- 3. Uniformity of Shape (25%)
 - a. Egg is consistent in shape.
- 4. Shell Texture (25%)
 - a. Egg is not rough, wrinkled, porous, or has ridges.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the egg (chicken) contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Bring your entry, accompanied with a removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry, to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date.

Garden Haul

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Garden Haul

RULES

- 1. Garden haul must be from one's own home garden or plot at a community garden.
- 2. Garden haul must be from a single harvest on one day.
- 3. Individuals may not submit more than one entry.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Quantity (40%)
 - a. The sheer quantity of fruits and/or vegetables is impressive.
- 2. Variety (30%)
 - a. There is a nice variety of different fruits and/or vegetables in the haul.
- 3. Color (30%)
 - a. The haul includes a beautiful rainbow of fruits and/or vegetables.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the garden haul contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Submit a photo of your entry at https://forms.gle/1qAsaamC1HnWmneS9 by August 31. Note that uploading documents to that form requires a Google account sign in. If you are unable to access or submit the form, please send your photo submission to contests@dcstatefair.org, with the subject line "Garden Haul Contest Submission." In the email, include your name, the email you used to register for the contest, and the name of the entry.

Honey

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Honey

RULES

- 1. You must be an amateur beekeeper.
- 2. You can enter one jar of honey.
- 3. All types of honey displayed must be protected from honeybees and other insects. Clear glass jars are recommended for this purpose.
- 4. Submissions should be in a clear, glass jar with no imprints or labels, so no Mason (canning) jars. Minimum size is 8 oz; one pound is preferred.
- 5. All beekeepers and hives entering the contest must be a resident of the District of Columbia to be eligible to compete.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Density or Moisture Content (20%)
 - a. Moisture content over 18.6% will result in zero points. All honey contains moisture or water. Excess moisture increases the growth of yeast cells that can result in fermentation and make honey unfit for human consumption. Judges often use a cut-off point of 18.6% and disqualify entries with additional moisture; in this case entries will receive no points and advice on honey handling.
- 2. Absence of Granulation or Crystallization (20%)
 - a. All honey will eventually solidify (granulate or crystallize). Neither crystallization nor granulation are good attributes for liquid honey prepared for judging or for sale. Crystals create unpleasant grit in the honey. A more serious problem is that the formation of granules/crystals in liquid honey will increase the moisture content of the remaining liquid portion of the product which can lead to fermentation.
- 3. Cleanliness (20%)
 - a. Cleanliness including the absence of lint, dirt, wax, and foam are among the most easily controlled factors by the beekeeper. The terms are self-explanatory with the possible exception of foam, which refers to air bubbles trapped in the honey.
- 4. Flavor (20%)
 - a. Flavor is a very subjective characteristic. In this situation the use of flavor as a factor in judging honey will be limited to checking for off flavors not produced by the bees (I.e. residue from mite treatments, feeding).
- 5. Container Appearance: Cleanliness and Uniformity (20%)
 - a. Honey should be presented in a clear glass jar with no imprints or labels (and no Mason/canning jars). The minimum size is 8 oz, but one-pound jars are preferred. Honey fill should be even with the "fill line" below the cap to ensure accuracy and uniformity of volume. The judges will pay special attention to the cleanliness and lack of wear to the container and its lid. This attention to container and lid cleanliness includes the inside of the lid.

Micro Garden

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Micro Garden

RULES

- 1. Micro garden must be in or around one's home, such as on a windowsill or front steps.
- 2. Micro garden must include more than one fruit, vegetable, or flower.
- 3. Individuals may submit up to two entries.
- 4. All individuals entering this contest must be a resident of the District of Columbia.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Use of Space (50%)
 - a. Micro garden creatively uses the space, including containers and positioning that maximizes how much can be grown.
- 2. Variety (50%)
 - a. Micro garden includes a variety of fruits, vegetables, and/or flowers.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the micro garden contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Submit a photo of your entry at https://forms.gle/1qAsaamC1HnWmneS9 by August 31. Note that uploading documents to that form requires a Google account sign in. If you are unable to access or submit the form, please send your photo submission to contests@dcstatefair.org, with the subject line "Micro Garden Contest Submission." In the email, include your name, the email you used to register for the contest, and the name of the entry.

Tomato

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Best Red Tomato
- Best Non-Red Tomato
- Best Heirloom Tomato

- 1. The tomato must have been grown in a District residence, school, or community garden.
- 2. Individuals may not submit more than one entry for each of the three categories listed above.

3. If cherry tomatoes are being submitted, enough must be submitted to be roughly equivalent to the size of a beefsteak tomato.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Flavor (40%)
 - a. Tomato is flavorful, with a strong tomato taste. It is slightly acidic, juicy, and fresh tasting with a tender skin.
- 2. Firmness/Slicing Quality (25%)
 - a. Tomato has a dense, uniform thick wall with many seed cavities, completely filled with a jelly-like mass. The firmness of the tomato is pleasing: not too mushy (or mealy) and not too hard. The tomato should be such that it will bruise if dropped, yet is not over-ripe.
- 3. Exterior Color (25%)
 - a. Tomato has a uniform color, is free of green shoulders and has no evidence of blotchy ripening or other defects. The winning heirloom tomato can be multicolored.
- 4. Shape: (10%)
 - a. Tomato is either very symmetrical or has a unique, funky shape. If multiple cherry tomatoes are submitted, they are near uniform in size.

Vegetable/Fruit

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Funkiest Looking Vegetable/Fruit
- Heaviest Vegetable/Fruit
- Best Spud

RULES

1. Individuals may not register more than one entry for each of the three categories listed above.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- For funkiest looking vegetable or fruit, the winner will be 100% determined by which one strikes
 the judges as most funky, to include but not be exclusive of, unique shape, most warts, or most
 striking color pattern.
- 2. For heaviest vegetable or fruit, the winner will be 100% determined by the ones that reaches the highest number on a scale.
- 3. For best spud, the winner will be determined as follows:
 - a. Appearance (50%)

- i. Potato is smooth; uniformly-shaped; and free from cuts, bruises, green areas, or sprouts
- b. Firmness (50%)
 - i. Potato feels uniformly firm without soft spots.

Culinary Contests Rules

Biscuit

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Biscuit

RULES

- 1. Biscuits must be made from scratch (no prebaked, premade/packaged mixes).
- 2. At least four and up to six biscuits from the same batch must be submitted as one entry.
- 3. Individuals may not submit more than one entry.
- 4. Biscuits cannot contain any of the following: uncooked cream, cream cheese, Jell-O/gelatin, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage. No items that require refrigeration will be accepted.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - b. Biscuit has a buttery and rich flavor.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Biscuit is symmetrical with vertical sides.
 - b. Biscuit has a golden brown crust.
- 3. Texture (30%)
 - a. Biscuit is flaky and tender, not crumbly or dry.

- 1. Register for the biscuit contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Bring your entry to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Bread

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Best Sourdough
- Best Rye Bread
- Best Cornbread
- Best Focaccia

- 1. Individuals may not submit more than one entry for each of the four categories listed above.
- 2. Each entry must be a whole, unsliced loaf.
- 3. Each entry must be made from scratch (no prebaked, premade/packaged bread mixes).
- 4. Bread cannot contain any of the following: uncooked cream, cream cheese, Jell-O/gelatin, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage. No items that require refrigeration will be accepted.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - a. Sourdough has a delightful level of tanginess.
 - b. Rye bread has a vibrant, earthy flavor.
 - c. Cornbread is either sweet or savory, and includes a rich, distinct corn flavor.
 - d. Focaccia has a rich, subtle, slightly yeasty flavor.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Sourdough has a crispy crust with a caramelized brown color.
 - b. Rye bread has a dark, consistent color.
 - c. Cornbread has a bright golden color.
 - d. Focaccia has a dimpled look with air pockets throughout.
- 3. Texture (30%)
 - a. Sourdough is pleasantly chewy.
 - b. Rye bread is slightly dense and not tough or gummy.
 - c. Cornbread is moist and soft with a pleasant grainy texture.
 - d. Focaccia has a crisp crust and a light and chewy interior.

- Bring your entry to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Cake

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Best Chocolate Cake
- Best Non-Chocolate Cake
- Best Vegan Cake
- Best Gluten Free Cake

- 1. Individuals may not submit more than one entry for each of the four categories listed above.
- 2. Individuals may submit the same cake for more than one category (e.g., a vegan chocolate cake).

- 3. Each entry must be made from scratch. No mixes (cake, cookie, pudding, jello, frosting, icing or other mixes) will be accepted as ingredients in the entry.
- 4. Cake cannot contain any of the following: uncooked cream, cream cheese, Jell-O/gelatin, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage. No items that require refrigeration will be accepted.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - a. Cake is satisfying, nuanced, and sweet but not overly so.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Cake is appealing and well decorated or presented.
- 3. Texture (30%)
 - a. Cake is soft and moist.
 - b. Cake is fluffy and spongy, with an evenly airy crumb.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the cake contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- Bring your entry to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Meat Chili

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

Best Meat Chili

RULES

- 1. Beans can be canned, but no other canned ingredients may be used.
- 2. Individuals may not submit more than one entry.
- 3. Entry must be brought in a slow cooker or other appliance to keep it warm throughout judging.
- 4. Entry cannot contain any of the following: uncooked meat, uncooked dairy products, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage or might cause sickness.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - a. Chili is hearty and rich. Chili has an enjoyable level of spice.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Chili is an appetizing color, with key ingredients easily distinguished.
- 3. Texture (30%)

a. Meat in the chili is tender and not disintegrating. Chili has a pleasant level of chunkiness and is not too watery or too dry.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the chili contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Bring your entry in an appliance that can keep it warm to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Vegetarian or Vegan Chili

PRIZES

Blue (1st place), red (2nd place), and white (3rd place) ribbons will be awarded in the following category:

• Best Vegetarian or Vegan Chili

RULES

- 1. Beans can be canned, but no other canned ingredients may be used.
- 2. Individuals may not submit more than one entry.
- 3. Chili must be brought in a slow cooker or other appliance to keep it warm throughout judging.
- 4. Chili cannot contain any of the following: uncooked dairy products, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage or might cause sickness.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - a. Chili is hearty and rich. Chili has an enjoyable level of spice.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Chili is an appetizing color, with key ingredients easily distinguished.
- 3. Texture (30%)
 - a. Ingredients in the chili are tender and not disintegrating. Chili has a pleasant level of chunkiness and is not too watery or too dry.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the chili contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Bring your entry in an appliance that can keep it warm to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Cider

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Best Sweet Cider
- Best Dry Cider

RULES

- 1. Entries must be submitted in two 12 oz. to 25.4 oz. bottles. The bottles may be corked and caged or have a swing top. The bottles will not be returned to contest participants.
- 2. Individuals may not submit more than one entry for each of the two categories listed above.
- 3. Individuals must be 21 years of age or older to participate in the cider contest.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Flavor (100%)
 - a. Cider has an enjoyable and refreshing taste.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Register for the cider contest at https://dcstatefair.org/2023contests by August 31.
- 2. Bring your entry to a to-be-announced public transit accessible bar on Saturday September 9 at a to-be-announced time in the afternoon/early evening. Exact location and time will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Cookie

PRIZES

One blue (1st place) ribbon will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- Best Cookie
- Best Vegan Cookie
- Best Gluten Free Cookie

- 1. Individuals may not submit more than one entry for each of the three categories listed above.
- 2. Individuals may submit the same cookie for more than one category (e.g., a vegan, gluten free cookie).
- 3. Each entry must be made from scratch (no prebaked, premade/packaged mixes).
- 4. You must submit at least eight cookies from the same batch.
- 5. Cookies cannot contain any of the following: uncooked cream, cream cheese, Jell-O/gelatin, raw eggs, or other products that are high risk for spoilage. No items that require refrigeration will be accepted.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Taste (40%)
 - a. Cookie is satisfying, nuanced, and sweet but not overly so.
- 2. Appearance (30%)
 - a. Cookie looks appetizing and holds its shape.
- 3. Texture (30%)
 - a. Cookie has an appealing level of crispiness and/or softness.

- 2. Bring your entry to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Library at 901 G St NW on Saturday September 9 between 10 am and 12 pm. Exact room location will be sent closer to the date. Alongside your entry, bring the following:
 - a. A removable label that includes your name, the contest category, and the name of the entry.
 - b. A list of ingredients used in making your entry.

Homebrew

PRIZES

3. Liquid (20%)

a. Clear with no unnatural cloudiness. Free of bubbles, sediment, mold, and foreign matter (stems, cores etc.).

4. Color (20%)

a. Even color characteristic of cooked product. No artificial coloring. Color and translucency uniform throughout the jar. Free of discoloration or blemishes on food pieces.

5. Texture/Consistency (20%)

a. Pieces appear plump, not shriveled or shrunken. Food pieces evenly sliced or chopped. Pleasing aroma appropriate for product; no indication of spoilage. Spices and seasonings not overwhelming. Jams are made from crushed fruits cooked to a smooth consistency that will mound up on a spoon but not jelly firm.

 - c. Aerosol sprays or Aerosol strings (silly string)
 - d. Any poisonous, explosive substance, or any harmful chemicals
 - e. Any liquid detergents
 - f. Parts that would expose the public, judges, or volunteers to injury (e.g., sharp edges or points)
- 5. Entries must be submitted in a sealed bag or container with lid.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- 1. Appearance (40%)
 - a. Slime has an appealing look that catches the eye and sparks curiosity.
- 2. Texture (20%)
 - a. Slime has a pleasant texture when squished and can stretch some before it breaks.
- 3. Sound (20%)
 - a. Slime makes a fun sound when squished.
- 4. Creativity (20%)
